Conflicts of Interest, Grant Support, and Financial Disclosure Policy

The **Axis Journal of Agriculture & Biological Sciences (AJABS)** mandates full transparency from all authors concerning any financial or personal relationships that could be perceived as unduly influencing their research. This policy covers conflicts of interest, grant support, and other financial disclosures to maintain the integrity and credibility of the scholarly record.

Conflicts of Interest:

Authors must disclose all relationships and activities that constitute or could be perceived as a conflict of interest within the thirty-six months preceding manuscript submission. This includes, but is not limited to:

- **Financial interests** such as employment, consultancies, stock ownership or options, honoraria, grants, patents (pending or awarded), and travel allowances.
 - **Personal relationships**, academic rivalries, or institutional affiliations with organizations having a direct financial or ideological stake in the research outcomes, such as agribusiness corporations, biotechnology firms, or advocacy groups.
- If no such conflicts exist, authors must explicitly state: "The authors declare no conflicts of interest."

Grant Support and Financial Disclosure:

All sources of financial support for the work reported must be explicitly acknowledged. This includes grant numbers, funding agency names, and in-kind support (e.g., provision of seeds, equipment, or laboratory facilities). For research funded by an entity with a commercial or ideological interest in the outcome, authors must provide a statement affirming their full independence in conducting the research. The statement must certify that the authors had complete and unrestricted access to all study data, bore sole responsibility for the data analysis and interpretation, and that the funder did not have undue influence over the results or their presentation.

Reviewer and Editor Disclosure:

Reviewers and editors are also required to disclose any potential conflicts of interest that could compromise their objectivity when handling a manuscript. They must recuse themselves from the review process if such a conflict exists.

Publication of Disclosures:

In adherence to the principle of transparency, all disclosed conflicts of interest, grant support details, and financial disclosures will be published prominently within the article. This ensures readers are fully informed of any potential influences on the research.

This policy is rigorously enforced to uphold the highest standards of accountability and trust in the scientific process, ensuring the research published in **AJABS** is perceived as objective and credible by the global academic community and the public.
